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## Playing Online Games



### Online Gaming

Online games can be fun and social, but they also come with risks. Here's what you should look out for and how to keep your child safe.

### Key Risks

#### Chatting with Strangers

- Many games allow text or voice chat, which can expose children to **inappropriate language** or **grooming risks**.
- **What to do:**
- Turn off chat features or filter bad language in settings.
- Restrict communication to “friends only” and check those friends are real-life friends.
- Teach your child how to **block and report** players.

#### Cyberbullying

- Children may behave differently online than face-to-face.
- **What to do:**
- Encourage respectful communication.
- Explain that bullying can include excluding players, criticising abilities, or ganging up on others.

#### In-App Purchases

- Many games offer extra items or subscriptions for real money.
- **What to do:**

- Avoid saving payment details.
- Set up restrictions or require a password for purchases.

### 🛡️ How to Protect Your Child

- **Set up parental controls** on both the game and the device/console.
- **Check age ratings** before buying or downloading games (look for PEGI or App Store/Google Play ratings).
- **Talk regularly** about online risks and remind your child to come to you or a trusted adult if something feels wrong.

## Reminder: Parent Controls



As many children may receive new technology or gaming gifts this Christmas, here's a quick reminder about the importance of setting up **appropriate parental controls**.

### 🎮 Games & Consoles

- 🚫 **Check age ratings** – Look at the PEGI rating for any new games. Remember: PEGI rates *gameplay*, so even if the age rating seems suitable, check whether the game includes communication features.
- 💬 **Review communication settings** – If a game allows chat or interaction with others, adjust or disable these features based on what's appropriate for your child.
- 🏠 **Set device controls** – Add spending limits and other safeguards on the console itself.

-  **Set parental controls** to block unwanted purchases, restrict age-inappropriate content, and manage privacy settings.
-  **Check app suitability** – Always review any apps your child requests to make sure they're age-appropriate.
