Attendance Matters



REMINDER

Attendance

It is important that children come to school on time every day. There is a link between good school attendance and high-level attainment. Regardless of the reason, if your child is absent from school it will impact on their learning. Parents and carers are legally responsible for ensuring their child attends school every day and on time.

Too ill to attend school?

Reminder: Children can attend school with minor ailments (e.g. toothache, stomach ache, headache, sore throat, cold), over the counter medicines can be given at home before school.

School will contact you if they become too ill to remain in school. Children should be off school for 48 hours if they have sickness or diarrhoea.

Reporting Absence

It is a parent/carer's responsibility to notify school if their child is absent and a reason must be provided. We ask that parents/carers ring school to report their child's absence. A voicemail can be left on our pupil absence line.

If your child is unwell, please contact school with details of the nature of the illness so that we can log it and therefore track patterns, trends and common illnesses across school, year groups or individual classes. Should no reason be provided when initial contact is made with school, we will endeavour to make contact with parents to ascertain the nature of the illness as soon as possible.

Leave in Term Time (holidays)

Children are not entitled to holidays in term time. Family holidays should be taken during school holiday periods. If a parent intends to take their child out of school for a leave of absence during term time, they must have requested this in advance. All leave of absence during term time requests will be unauthorised except for exceptional circumstances (at the discretion of the Headteacher).

You can be fined for taking your child on holiday during term time without the Headteacher's permission. This also applies if you do not submit a request form and the Headteacher has reason to believe the child was absent for the purpose of a holiday. Please note, not all reports of illness are accepted or authorised. It is always best to be honest with school and tell us you are going on holiday (the children usually tell us all about it when they get back to school!) and school may make home visits if we believe that a pupil may be on holiday or we have any other concerns regarding a child's persistent absence. If, as a school, we suspect you are on holiday and your child may not be ill, a referral for a fine can still be made and it will be up to you as the parent to prove otherwise.

If your child is participating in a sporting festival/event and we receive a signed letter from the club/team manager/coach, stating which child/children are attending and the specific dates, we can authorise the absence as participation in approved sporting activities (at the discretion of the Headteacher). Again, please be honest with us!

Penalty Notices

The threshold for Penalty Notice fines is 5 days / 10 sessions of unauthorised absence over a 10-school week period. When a school becomes aware that a child's absence has met the

threshold, they must consider whether a penalty notice should be issued. This relates to ALL unauthorised absences, not just holidays.

Penalty notices are set at £160 (per child, per parent) and must be paid within the statutory 28-day deadline.

The first Penalty notice fine issued to a parent is reduced to £80 if it is paid in full, within 21 days of issue. All fines must be paid within 28 days of issue otherwise parents may be prosecuted in court.

A second fine issued to a parent/carer for a child who is absent from school without authorisation is fixed at £160, with no option to pay at a reduced rate if the fine is paid within the first 21 days.

Parents/Carers can only receive a maximum of two fines for any individual child over a three-year rolling period for an unauthorised absence from school.

A third request for a fine within a three-year rolling period would result in the matter being referred directly to the Magistrates court.

If a parent/carer is prosecuted at court, they could receive a fine of up to £2,500, a community order or a jail sentence of up to three months. The court could also give you a [Parenting Order](#).

Parents who decide not to pay a fine and contest the matter in court should seek independent legal advice before doing so.

Healthy Snacks

REMINDER

At Sherwood, we encourage all children to bring a snack into school for playtime as it is proven that this can help with focus and concentration in lessons and therefore enable them to make better progress. However, it is also important that we provide our children with appropriate snacks too.

Where possible, please aim to send your child with healthy options, such as: a piece of fruit, a cereal bar (no nuts) or small bag of crisps. Try to avoid chocolate or sweets, as these do not help sustain long periods of concentration nor are they healthy options.

At Sherwood, we work hard to encourage our pupils to see the value in being active and taking care of their health so we must ensure that their snack choices support this.

We have some exciting news!


From **September**, we will be receiving government funding to offer a **FREE breakfast club** for **all children**, starting **30 minutes before school**.

To help us prepare, we are running a **trial week** from **Monday 27 April to Friday 1 May**.

Trial Week Details


 **Time:** From **8.15am**

 **Arrival window:** Children **must arrive between 8.15am and 8.25am**

 Children **will not be admitted after 8.25am**

 **Food available:** Toast, cereal, fruit and juice

 **No booking required** – just turn up!

 Children who already attend our usual *paid* Breakfast Club from **7.30am** will automatically be included in the *free* breakfast provision from **8.15am**. For this **trial week only**, payments for the paid Breakfast Club will be adjusted to include a discount for the free breakfast period. Normal booking via ParentPay is still required for attendance between **7.30am and 8.15am**. Please contact the school office if you have any questions about payments.

Year 5's 'Growing Up' Lesson

Year 5

On **Friday 5th June 2026**, the children in Year 5 will be having a lesson on 'growing up' and body changes in adolescence. This is in line with the Science curriculum for Year 5 and their unit on Animals Including Humans. The boys and girls will be taught in separate groups to enable them to feel more comfortable.

The lessons will focus on the changes the body goes through as they enter puberty. This will include the physical and emotional changes they will go through.

The children will have the chance to post questions in a box in the classroom that they wish to be answered in the lesson. If the Year 5 staff decide a question is beyond what they teach in school, they will refer it to home to be answered.

Pharmacy first Minor ailment

Here's a reminder about the Pharmacy First Minor Ailment information. It covers the ailments that can be assessed and treated, if needed within the pharmacy without the need for a GP appointment usually on the same day (unless the condition is particularly severe or complex) enabling the child to return to school sooner than waiting for an appointment, starting antibiotic treatment more quickly if needed or offering over the counter medication to enable the condition to be eased and facilitate return to school.
