Parent, Carer and Visitor Conduct Expectations



At Sherwood Junior School we are very fortunate to have supportive and friendly parents and carers, who recognise and understand the importance of a good, open and positive working relationship and partnership between home and school.

We would like to remind all parents, carers and visitors to our school about our guidance about expected conduct. This is so that we can continue to ensure a safe and positive school environment for every child and adult working in or visiting our school.

In order to ensure a peaceful and safe school environment, the school will not tolerate parents, carers or visitors who exhibit the following:

- Disruptive, aggressive or threatening behaviour which interferes or threatens to interfere with the operation of a classroom, an employee's office or any other area of the school grounds including after school activities. Examples could include using offensive language /any form of swearing / verbal abuse/ threatening emails /texts/phone calls, displaying temper /threatening to do actual bodily harm / displaying physical aggression including the threat and act of assault.
- Approaching someone else's child in order to discuss with them or to reprimand them because of their actions towards their own child. Such an approach may be seen as an assault on that child and may have legal consequences.
- Smoking and consumption of alcohol and drugs on the school site.

Should any of the above behaviour occur on our school premises, the school may feel it necessary to contact the appropriate authorities and, if necessary, ban the offending adult from entering the school grounds.

We will do our utmost to resolve all issues and concerns but we will only deal with them if they are brought to us in an appropriate way. Although the adults in school will do their best to be available to speak with parents/carers, we would like to remind all parents/carers to be respectful and appreciate that it is not always possible for a member of staff to be immediately available. However, we will endeavour to make contact with parents/carers as soon as is practically possible. We are grateful that the majority of parents/carers recognise this and appreciate that the staff in school are exceptionally busy and that they also have their own family commitments so are not always available immediately after school.

Whilst we understand that parents and school may not always agree, we hope that parents will uphold the expectations outlined in this policy whenever there may be a concern or problem, so that the issue can be resolved as quickly and as calmly as possible and without causing any additional unwanted stress or anxiety to any of the parties involved (including the staff at school).

Leaver's Assembly

Year 6 Leaver's Disco

To celebrate the end of their time at Sherwood - Year 6 will be having a Leaver's Disco on **Thursday 24th July**. This will be held at school in the lower hall. Children are invited to come back to school from **5:00pm-6:30pm** and dress in 'party' clothes!

Tickets are priced at £5.00 and this will include a disco, chip cob, drinks and treats. Your child will need to be collected from school by an adult at the end of the disco.

If your child would like to attend, please return the slip on the letter sent out with your child with £5.00 cash to school by Friday 18th July 2025.

Important...

We understand that the children will be wanting to take photos during the disco. The children will **NOT** be allowed to use their own phones or devices during the disco. Our usual

school rules about phones and devices will apply. Our school iPads will be available for them to use and we will share all the photos on our website once we have checked them to ensure they comply with the parental permissions we have in school. If we see a child using their own phone, it will be removed and a parent or carer will be asked to collect it after the disco.

Last day of school Friday 25 July - shirt signing

We know many of the children like to 'get their shirts signed' on the last day of school and we have usually facilitated this after school on the playground. However, this year we will organise some time during the school day for the children to sign shirts. Please make sure your child knows whether you give them permission to have their shirt signed as school does not accept any responsibility for children having a shirt signed against their parents' wishes. Your child may wish to bring a separate shirt to be signed instead of the one they are wearing - that's your personal choice.

We know that some parents have bought special leavers' shirts/t-shirts that have been printed. These are not part of our school uniform so we ask that children do not wear them to school in the next few weeks. However, we will make an exception on the last day of school. If you have bought a special 'leavers' t-shirt', your child can wear it to school on Friday 25 July as part of their uniform. If your child is wearing one, please make sure they know whether they are allowed to have it signed or if they have a different shirt to sign.

Autograph Books

Each child will be given an autograph book as a leaving gift from school during the last week to collect messages from the other children in Year 6 and the staff.

Day of Sports & Whole School Picnic



Reminder:

We are planning a 'day of sports' for the children and a whole school picnic on **Wednesday 2 July**. During the morning, the children will participate in different sporting activities and we ask that all children wear their PE uniform. At **12.30pm**, we would love parents/carers/family members to come along and join us for our whole school picnic. Bring a chair or a blanket to sit on whilst you eat on the school field! The whole school will be having a picnic and it promises to be a fun, family time!

There will be no hot dinners available on this date and we ask all children to bring a packed lunch. If your child is entitled to free school meals and you would like them to have a picnic provided by school, please order it on ParentPay.

Head Lice



We acknowledge that headlice is continually an issue within our school, as it is within many primary schools.

We would like to encourage all parents to regularly check their child's hair and take the necessary action if your child does have headlice.

How to Get Rid of Head Lice (from the NHS website)

Treat head lice as soon as you spot them.

You should check everyone in the house and start treating anyone who has head lice on the same day.

There's no need to keep your child off school if they have head lice.

Wet combing

Lice and nits can be removed by wet combing. You should try this method first.

You can buy a special fine-toothed comb (detection comb) online or from pharmacies to remove head lice and nits.

There may be instructions on the pack, but usually you:

- wash hair with ordinary shampoo
- apply lots of conditioner (any conditioner will do)
- comb the whole head of hair, from the roots to the ends

It usually takes about 10 minutes to comb short hair, and 20 to 30 minutes for long, frizzy or curly hair.

Do wet combing on days 1, 5, 9 and 13 to catch any newly hatched head lice. Check again that everyone's hair is free of lice on day 17.
