## Spring Term Curriculum

---

*This term, we are learning about so many wonderful and exciting topics across school.*

---

### **Year 3 - All Around Us**

In the Spring term our topic is All Around Us. We will be learning about our locality, what makes up the UK and the physical and human features. We will spend time looking at maps and using compass directions. We will think about the weather in the UK and how to measure it during our visit to Perlethorpe on Monday 16th March. In our science work, we will be exploring forces and magnets and thinking about light. We will also be investigating kites in DT linked to our science. In art, we will be focusing on collage. In PE, we are working

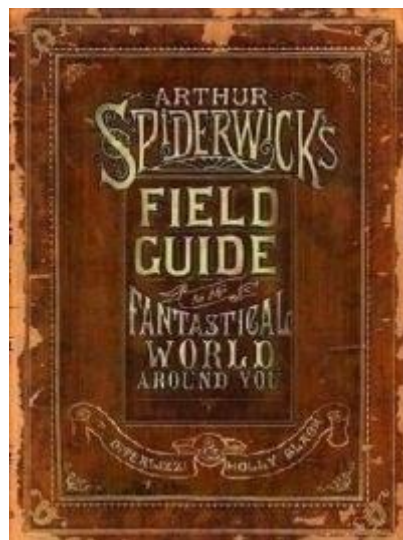
on gymnastic moves and 3M are swimming. Our RSHE work this term focuses on what families are like and what makes a community.

We would love to see parents and carers in school on **Friday 20th March at 8.50am** to share our learning this term.



#### **Year 4 - All Things Great and Small!**

This term, our theme is All Things Great and Small! In Geography, we will build on last term's learning to explore rivers as key features of physical geography, including fieldwork around the River Meden. In English, we will use *Arthur Spiderwick's Field Guide to the Fantastical World Around You* from The Spiderwick Chronicles to inspire our writing, creating our own detailed field guide entries. In science, we will learn about animals, including humans, and living things and their habitats, linking our work to the mythical creatures from the text. In R.E., we will explore pilgrimages through drama, and in art, we will refine our textiles skills to create our own fantasy settings.



#### **Year 5 - What A Wonderful World!**

There will be brilliant learning in Year 5 this term, mostly based around our topic: What a Wonderful World.

This unit will be geography based and develop a greater understanding of the world and how we, as humans, have an impact. As part of this unit, we will be exploring our local area's human and physical geographical features, with a view to deciding the best place for a new Solar Farm. We will be visited by Jack, an amazing actor, who will lead the children in a workshop to understand the different characters in our novel 'Holes'.

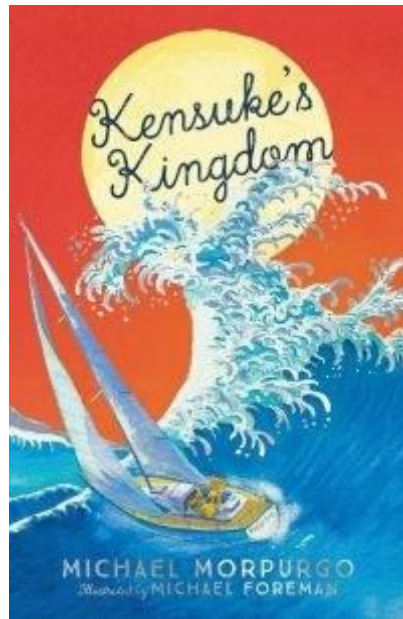
Our writing will be persuasive writing and a narrative based on the film 'Holes'. In science, we are learning about living things and their habitats, the children will learn about different life cycles and be able to compare them. In the first half of the spring term, we developed our balancing skills through gymnastics in our P.E lessons and outside we showed off our teamwork and sportsmanship through handball. We will also look at tennis and strengthening our cores through Pilates. Our music will be based on jazz music and we will be inviting parent's to our short performance. We will be cooking using seasonal foods and will be creating an animal collage in art.



### **Year 6 - Mother Nature and Her Earth**

Ever been stranded on a desert island? Ever wondered why it's so hot in some countries but not in others? Well, Year 6 are going to spend this term exploring Mother Nature and her Earth alongside reading Michael Morpurgo's captivating novel 'Kensuke's Kingdom'. Throughout the term, we will explore a range of geography from longitude and latitude to coastal erosion, giving our children the opportunity to see the world like they never have done before. In art, we will take inspiration from our focus text and create some amazing sketches, whilst in science we will delve deeper into the world of electricity. There really is so much to be learning, so everyday will be jam-packed! Not to forget a special trip to the great outdoors to learn more about bush craft and survival skills - Just like Michael in our book!

It's going to be so much fun Year 6!



## Year 6 trip to Sherwood Forest

### **Year 6 Trip to Sherwood Forest on Wednesday 18th March 2026**

Year 6 are planning to visit Sherwood Forest as part of our English and Topic unit 'Mother Nature's Earth' and our novel this term, 'Kensuke's Kingdom'. Throughout the day we will take part in several survival-based activities to mimic the survival skills modelled in the book and explore some of the mini biomes within the forest. The children will take part in orienteering and shelter building so will be outside for the majority of the day.

**The cost of the trip per child is £16.10.** Please make payment via ParentPay. You must also give consent for your child to attend the trip and provide an emergency contact number for the day of the trip via ParentPay.

If you are experiencing financial difficulties at this time and would like to discuss this, please contact the school office.

The coach will leave school at 9:30am so pupils will need to arrive on time to be registered prior to the trip. We will arrive back at school for the normal finishing time of 3:20pm, however if this changes significantly, we will contact you by text.

Children are expected to wear school uniform on the top (jumper) and joggers/trousers/outdoor wear on the bottom, with sensible footwear, but no football shoes or astro trainers are to be worn. They will also need a warm coat.

Children will need a healthy packed lunch and drink (no fizzy drinks) in a bag or lunchbox. If your child receives free school meals and you would like school to provide a packed lunch, you will have the opportunity to order one via ParentPay.

Any parents with a DBS check carried out by school, who are available to support us on this day, please let us know.

Please make payment via your ParentPay account along with the necessary consent and contact details by **Friday 6th March 2026**.

### Changes to Meden School Day for September 2026

Dear Parents, Carers and Members of the School Community,

I am writing to inform you of an important change to the structure and timings of the school day at Meden School, which will take effect from **September 2026**.

From September, the school will move from a six-period day of 50-minute lessons to a **five-period day of 60-minute lessons**, operating on a **two-week timetable cycle**. As part of this change, there will also be an adjustment to the start and finish times of the school day.

### Changes to the School Day

- Current school day: 08:45 – 15:25 (Monday – Thursday) 08:45 – 14:35 (Friday)
- **New school day: 08:30 – 15:00 Monday to Friday**

This represents a **15-minute earlier start** and a **25-minute earlier finish** than the current school day. Importantly, the **total teaching time each day remains the same**, at 300 minutes.

### Why are we making this change?

This change has been carefully planned and aligns with our whole-school priorities around teaching and learning, feedback, curriculum development, SEND provision and student achievement.

By reducing the number of lessons taught each day, we significantly reduce time lost to transitions, movement and settling between lessons. This enables us to increase the proportion of the day spent in meaningful learning, while creating a calmer and more focused environment for students.

Longer lessons allow teachers to:

- Deepen and reinforce learning through consolidation and feedback
- Use a wider range of teaching approaches, including discussion, reading, writing and practical work
- Reduce the feeling of lessons being rushed

For students, this supports greater focus, stronger understanding and improved outcomes.

#### **What will the new school day look like?**

- Students will be taught in **five 60-minute lessons per day**
- The school will operate a **two-week timetable**, allowing greater flexibility in how subjects are allocated across the fortnight
- **Break and lunch times will be staggered**, supporting calm movement around the site

Indicative break and lunch times include:

- Morning break: **10:05-10:20** or **11:05-11:20**
- Lunch: **12:20-13:00** or **13:20-14:00**

Individual timetables will be shared in advance of September 2026.

#### **What are the benefits?**

We expect this change to deliver clear benefits, including:

- Increased effective learning time within the school day
- Deeper learning and improved lesson quality
- Fewer transitions and reduced disruption
- Improved wellbeing for both students and staff
- Greater flexibility across the curriculum

This change is about **using time more efficiently**, not reducing learning time.

#### **Moving forward**

We will continue to work closely with staff to ensure lessons are well-structured and engaging within the new model. As with all significant changes, we will monitor its impact carefully and listen to feedback from students, staff and parents.



Here's a reminder about the Pharmacy First Minor Ailment information. It covers the ailments that can be assessed and treated, if needed within the pharmacy without the need for a GP appointment usually on the same day (unless the condition is particularly severe or complex) enabling the child to return to school sooner than waiting for an appointment, starting antibiotic treatment more quickly if needed or offering over the counter medication to enable the condition to be eased and facilitate return to school.

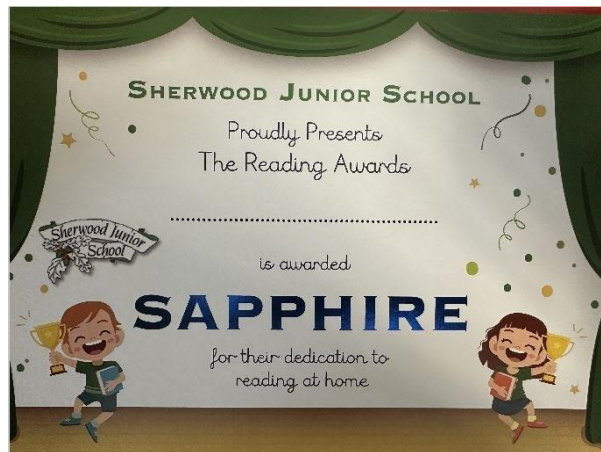
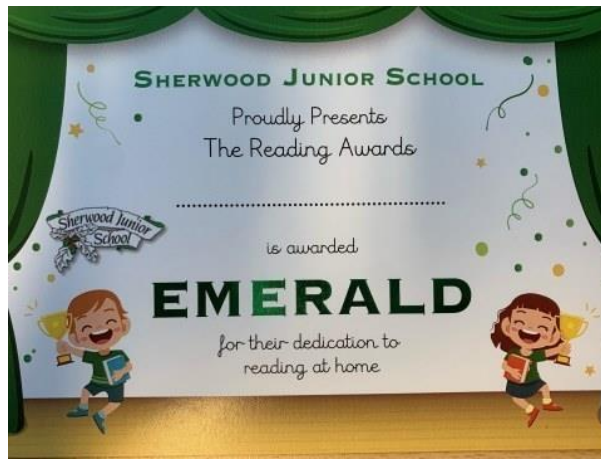
